Community Quiltmaking for Good




Radioactive: Marie & Pierre Currie: A Tale of Love and Fallout

Remember New York State is 30th in low pay in Home Health care wages! And we are the ones who suffer if we stay in our home as we age and need help. None may be available because workers are making more in the fast food industry or elsewhere. With a HIGHER WAGE and a work force wanting to work variable hours, there will be a much greater chance to receive needed care when WE need it.
